
Keith Gilbertson Scholarships

The Jewson family scholarships are awarded to two students with plans to attend a University or WITC. Students are to be majoring in education at the university level or a vocational education at WITC.





Dan Morgan Memorial Scholarships






Superior Jaycee's Outstanding Young Adult Scholarship


Glenn "Tony" Tinker Scholarship
